# INFORMATIVA SULL'INDAGINE DELLA MAGISTRATURA SUL PRESIDENTE MELONI PER IL CASO ALMASRI

Il 5 febbraio si è tenuta l'informativa urgente sulla vicenda di Nyeem Osama **Almasri** dei **Ministri della Giustizia, Carlo Nordio e dell'Interno, Matteo Piantedosi** presso la Camera dei Deputati e il Senato. Nel corso dell'informativa il Ministro Nordio ha illustrato le **ragioni giuridiche** che hanno portato al mancato arresto di Almasri, mentre il Ministro Piantedosi ha ricostruito la **dinamica operativa** della sua espulsione e il motivo per cui è stato rimpatriato. Il Ministro della Giustizia Nordio ha inoltre sollevato **dubbi sulla legittimità del mandato di arresto emesso dalla Corte Penale Internazionale** contro Almasri, evidenziando contraddizioni nei reati e nel periodo contestato.

# DICHIARAZIONI DEL MINISTRO TAJANI RIGUARDO LE POLITICHE COMMERCIALI DI TRUMP

Il 3 febbraio, il Ministro degli Affari Esteri Antonio Tajani ha commentato le **politiche tariffarie del Presidente degli Stati Uniti Donald Trump**, dichiarando che una guerra commerciale sarebbe dannosa per tutte le parti coinvolte. L'Italia, ha sottolineato il Ministro, è ben posizionata per fungere da efficace ambasciatrice degli interessi europei, data la forte **interconnessione tra le economie americana ed europea**.

Tajani ha anche evidenziato che sarà **essenziale ridurre i costi di produzione in Europa**, un obiettivo che potrebbe essere raggiunto attraverso riforme alle norme del Green Deal, la riduzione della burocrazia e il semplificare i quadri normativi. Il Ministro ha delineato una strategia per proteggere le imprese italiane, che include l'esplorazione di nuovi mercati, con l'obiettivo di **sostenere la crescita delle esportazioni**, raggiungendo i 700 miliardi di euro entro la fine dell'attuale legislatura.

# VIA LIBERA DELLA COMMISSIONE EUROPEA AI BONUS GIOVANI E DONNE

Il 31 gennaio, la Commissione Europea ha approvato i bonus per l'occupazione di giovani e donne previsti dal **Decreto Coesione** approvato nel luglio 2024. L'Italia destinerà 1,1 miliardi di euro, in parte finanziati dal fondo di coesione FSE+, per **incentivare le assunzioni a tempo indeterminato di giovani under 35 e donne residenti nel Mezzogiorno**.

I datori di lavoro potranno beneficiare di un esonero contributivo fino a 500 euro mensili, che sale a 650 euro per le assunzioni nel Sud. La Ministra del Lavoro, Marina Calderone, ha definito l'approvazione un "**successo per il Governo Meloni e un'opportunità per il Paese**", stimando la

creazione di fino a 180.000 nuovi posti di lavoro. Il ministro per gli Affari Europei, Tommaso Foti, ha sottolineato l'importanza della misura per ridurre i divari territoriali e rafforzare l'occupazione stabile.

## DISPOSIZIONI DI AGGIORNAMENTO DEL DDL CAPITALI

Il 29 gennaio, la Commissione Finanze del Senato ha proseguito l'esame del disegno di legge presentato dal Ministro dell'economia e delle finanze, Giancarlo Giorgetti, riguardo le **disposizioni di aggiornamento della legge delega sui capitali** approvata lo scorso marzo 2024.

La Commissione ha concluso l'esame dei 35 emendamenti e dei 42 subemendamenti presentati, approvandone alcuni. In particolare:

- **1.1000/28 (Lega):** Si prevede l'adeguamento della normativa nazionale al [Regolamento \(UE\) 2024/886](#) sui **bonifici istantanei in euro**, con nuove regole per la partecipazione ai sistemi di pagamento, requisiti di governance e tutela fondi per istituti di pagamento e moneta elettronica, nonché sanzioni fino a **5 milioni di euro** per violazioni gravi.

Il disegno di legge ha come obiettivo principale l'aggiornamento della delega per sostenere la competitività dei capitali e riformare le disposizioni sui mercati dei capitali e le società di capitali.

In particolare, una delle principali modifiche riguarda la **proroga dei termini per l'adozione dei decreti legislativi** relativi alla riforma dei mercati dei capitali, estendendo il periodo **da 12 a 24 mesi**. Inoltre, il termine per l'adozione di eventuali decreti correttivi e integrativi viene esteso da 18 a 24 mesi.

## AGGIORNAMENTI PDL PARTECIPAZIONE DEI LAVORATORI AL CAPITALE

Il 27 gennaio l'Aula della Camera dei Deputati ha iniziato e rinviato l'esame il testo della proposta di legge d'iniziativa popolare della CISL e delle abbinate **in materia di partecipazione dei lavoratori al capitale, alla gestione e ai risultati dell'impresa**. I relatori del provvedimento hanno illustrato l'atto.

Il testo, a seguito della votazione degli emendamenti era stato parzialmente modificato. In particolare, è stata esclusa la partecipazione dei lavoratori in banche e istituti di credito. Inoltre per il 2025 i dividendi corrisposti ai lavoratori e derivanti dalle azioni attribuite in sostituzione di premi di risultato fino a 1.500 euro annui sono **esenti dalle imposte sui redditi per il 50% del loro ammontare**. Sono alcune delle novità approvate.

Inoltre, un emendamento di maggioranza, ha modificato l'**articolo 3**, stabilendo che, nelle imprese con sistema dualistico, gli statuti **possono** prevedere la partecipazione dei lavoratori nel **consiglio di sorveglianza**, ma solo se disciplinata dai contratti collettivi. La formulazione originale, che lasciava intendere un automatismo, è stata eliminata.

**Importante notare che la copertura finanziaria dell'intervento normativo di cui sopra, è stata inserita in Manovra con l'istituzione di un fondo ad hoc istituito al MEF, da 72 milioni di euro per il 2025 e il 2026.**

Malagola (FDI), incontrato nella scorsa primavera e con cui Apco rimane in contatto: dunque, se fossero utili interlocuzioni su aspetti della proposta di legge da approfondire, siamo a disposizione per favorire un contatto in merito.*

## INTERROGAZIONE MINISTRO URSO SU TRANSIZIONE 5.0

Il 4 febbraio, alla Camera dei Deputati, il Ministro delle Imprese e del Made in Italy, Adolfo Urso, ha risposto ad un'interrogazione parlamentare presentata dall'On. Fenu (M5S), riguardo all'erogazione dei **crediti d'imposta legati alla misura Transizione 5.0**.

Il Ministro, nella sua risposta, ha evidenziato che il Piano Transizione 5.0 è stato istituito per supportare la transizione digitale ed energetica delle imprese italiane, con un credito d'imposta destinato alle imprese che investono in progetti che riducono i consumi energetici. Urso ha poi comunicato che il Ministero sta lavorando per **semplificare l'accesso agli incentivi**, in particolare per il Sud Italia.

Infine, il Ministro ha riferito che sono in corso **negoziazioni con la Commissione Europea per estendere la durata** dell'incentivo oltre il 31 dicembre 2025.

Il ministro delle Imprese e del Made in Italy, Adolfo Urso, ha accolto con favore l'approccio pragmatico della **"Bussola della Competitività"** dell'UE, un piano strategico scritto dalla Commissione Europea e volto a rafforzare la competitività delle imprese. Urso ha sottolineato l'importanza di questo strumento per promuovere la **semplificazione normativa** nell'Unione Europea, sostenendo la competitività delle imprese.

In tal senso il Ministro ha espresso apprezzamento per l'inserimento della revisione del regolamento CBAM (Meccanismo di Adeguamento del Carbonio alle Frontiere) nella Bussola della Competitività dell'UE. Durante un incontro a Bruxelles con il Commissario UE per l'Azione per il Clima, Wopke Hoekstra, Urso ha sottolineato l'importanza di questo passo per **proteggere le industrie energivore**, come la siderurgia, dalla concorrenza internazionale. Ha anche ribadito la necessità di portare avanti la revisione del regolamento sulle emissioni di CO<sub>2</sub> per i veicoli leggeri.

**With the beginning of the new year, it is time to reflect on our work during the last six months of 2024.**

### **Recent events and meetings**

#### **EFB Welcome Reception**

Aimed at spreading awareness of EFB and its work to newly elected and returning MEPs as they settled into the beginning of their mandates, we held a Welcome Reception at the Representation of Baden-Württemberg to the EU in Brussels on the 10th of September. The event brought together family business owners, policymakers from the EU Commission, in particular the representatives from DG GROW, newly elected and some re-elected MEPs along with some representatives of other business associations. #### **10th Family Business Summit**

Our 10th Family Business Summit took place in Rome between the 3rd and 5th of October. This event was the first of its kind as, it was the first time we attached an EFB summit to one of our chapter's national conferences. In conjunction with our Italian chapter AIDAF, we hosted a great event attracting approximately 500 people from around Europe. The topic was *The Power of People*. We had several sessions and talks with business owners from different family businesses and different generations, policymakers and academics to tackle the topic. Along with many opportunities to network and exchange ideas, we also had opportunities to visit Italian family businesses, thanks to AIDAF. Some of our summit's highlights included: EFB's President Mr Udo J. Vetter's opening speech on where family businesses fit in Europe, expressing the importance of family businesses that are all around us, the threats they are facing and the power of people when they come together. He then introduced EFB and its lobbying work in Brussels. Mr Vetter thanked the sponsors of the event For Talents and EY and our Italian chapter AIDAF along with Ms Giovanna Gregori, executive director of AIDAF and Cristina Bombassei, President of AIDAF for enabling us to host this event.

Ms Bombassei, AIDAF's President, spoke of the reports on European competitiveness and the single market reiterating that ownership matters.

From a discussion on the power of stewardship to a panel on how to balance the Green Deal with industrial competitiveness, the summit gave us an overarching view of how family businesses are

operating in the Single Market and the challenges they face in the current complex geopolitical and economic context.

We were fortunate to secure, a keynote speech from Mr Enrico Letta, chair of Jacques Delors Institute, who was in charge of the report on the future of the Single Market. His main message was that we need to tackle the fragmentation within the single market to remain competitive. *"At a national level, too many countries are thinking that they have gain keeping the situation as it is today, without considering that small gains for one country mean a big loss altogether. We pay the price of this big loss. What I wanted to do in this exercise was to send a red alarm. We are lagging. We are too complicated. We are too fragmented. We have to overcome all this disintegration and this fragmentation."* We could not agree more!

Moreover, we also had the pleasure of having a speech by Ms Martina Dlabajová, Member of the European Parliament from 2014-2024. She outlined what Europe looked like following the conclusion of the European Parliamentary elections of June 2024. She also added the importance of SMEs to the European economy and how EFB worked with her during her time at the European Parliament. The combined efforts of EFB and Ms Dlabajová in 2023, enabled her to include business transfers in a key resolution. She highlighted the role of EFB in raising the topic of business transfers as an issue.

### **Policy-related events and meetings**

EFB attended several policy-related events in the last few months of 2024. Below, you will find a summary of the main meetings and events. It is also important to note that since the College of Commissioners was agreed upon on the 27th of November and officially began its work on the 1st of December, there was a halt in the legislative procedure of the EU Institutions. Nevertheless, several important events took place during this time to discuss what the priorities in the Commission's Work Plan for 2025 should be. Many stakeholders, including ourselves, also evaluated what they thought should be worked on as soon as possible in Commission President von Der Leyen's second mandate.

### **SME Assembly 2024**

Between the 18th and 20th of November 2024 in Budapest, EFB representatives Mr Jesús Casado, EFB's Secretary General and Ms Joana Peixinho, EFB's Junior Policy Advisor, attended the SME Envoy Network meeting and the SME Assembly organised by the European Commission.

During the SME Envoy Network meeting, a point on SME policy in Hungary was presented. Here, Mr Casado intervened to ask about the measures planned for business transfers in the foreseeable future. His question raised a vital point: business transfers are critical to European competitiveness and job retention so, how will the topic be approached by the European Commission in the next

mandate? How will member states tackle the issue? EFB will continue to call for discussions on business transfers as a priority.

As the assembly began, important recommendations arose on the topics of better regulation and reduction of administrative burden, the need for sustainability – both human and environmental, scaling up, access to finance, highlighting best practices, streamlining the legal framework of public procurement, simplifying the Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive (CSDDD) and Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive (CSRD).

### **Other policy meetings**

Between the 20<sup>th</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup> of October, EFB's Secretary General Mr Jesús Casado, attended the national IEF - Instituto de la Empresa Familiar summit in Spain, where he spoke to Former Prime Minister of Italy and author of the Much More than a Market report Mr Enrico Letta. Mr Letta suggested that EFB should encourage its national chapters to communicate with their respective national governments as this helps to implement the recommendations of the report, thus helping family businesses thrive in a less fragmented single market. On the 23<sup>rd</sup> of October, Mr Casado had a meeting with Mr Bonifacio García-Porras, Head of Unit for Small and Medium Enterprises to discuss topics vital to the future of companies in Europe.

Ms Joana Peixinho attended three meetings put together by the European Commission's SME Envoy Network on 1<sup>st</sup> October, 11<sup>th</sup> December and 12<sup>th</sup> December. Here different policy topics were discussed such as: administrative burden, the SME test, public procurement and more.

During a meeting in November with Mr Ben Butters, CEO of EuroChambers, both Mr Butters and Mr Casado exchanged views on what the associations are working on. A discussion on how both EFB and EuroChambers can work together in the foreseeable future on topics of mutual interest was held.

### **EFB publications**

#### **Small Mid-Caps (SMCs)**

In October, we published a paper on Small Mid-Caps (SMCs) following a request from the European Commission's DG GROW to help determine what we think the category should include. In our view, the SMC definition is part of the larger topic that we have been calling for over the last few years. Namely, a European category for mid-caps.

#### **Background**

The Commission included the topic of mid-caps in their 2023 SME Relief Package, which was a very substantial win for us. In Action 18, the Commission noted that they will, “be attentive to the needs of companies that outgrow the thresholds of the SME definition, as well as the broader range of small mid-cap companies...”. The Commission also committed to developing a harmonised definition for SMCs and building a dataset based on the aforementioned definition. We are very happy with the positive steps in the development of a mid-cap definition.

While they are only looking at the small mid-caps for the moment, this gives us the momentum required to push for an entire mid-cap category.

### **Change course now or face irreversible decline - the family business call for competitiveness.**

In December, following the appointment of the new College of Commissioners and ahead of the release of the Commission's Work Programme, we released a paper that we sent to Commissioners, MEPs and key people in DG GROW calling for action on key issues impacting European competitiveness.

In our document, you will find five overarching pillars that have to be handled as soon as possible:

- Reduction of administrative burden and reporting.
- Re-thinking Europe's industrial strategy – strengthening Europe's industrial base, trade agreements, and job preservation.
- Increase investment in Research, Development, and Innovation.
- Closing the skills gap and preparing for the skills shift.
- The need for solid financing.
